history & definition

1989: Kimberlé Crenshaw coined the term "Intersectional Feminism"

- Explains how systems of oppression overlap to create distinct experiences for people with multiple marginalized identities
- The experience of two systems of oppression overlapping is greater than the sum of its parts

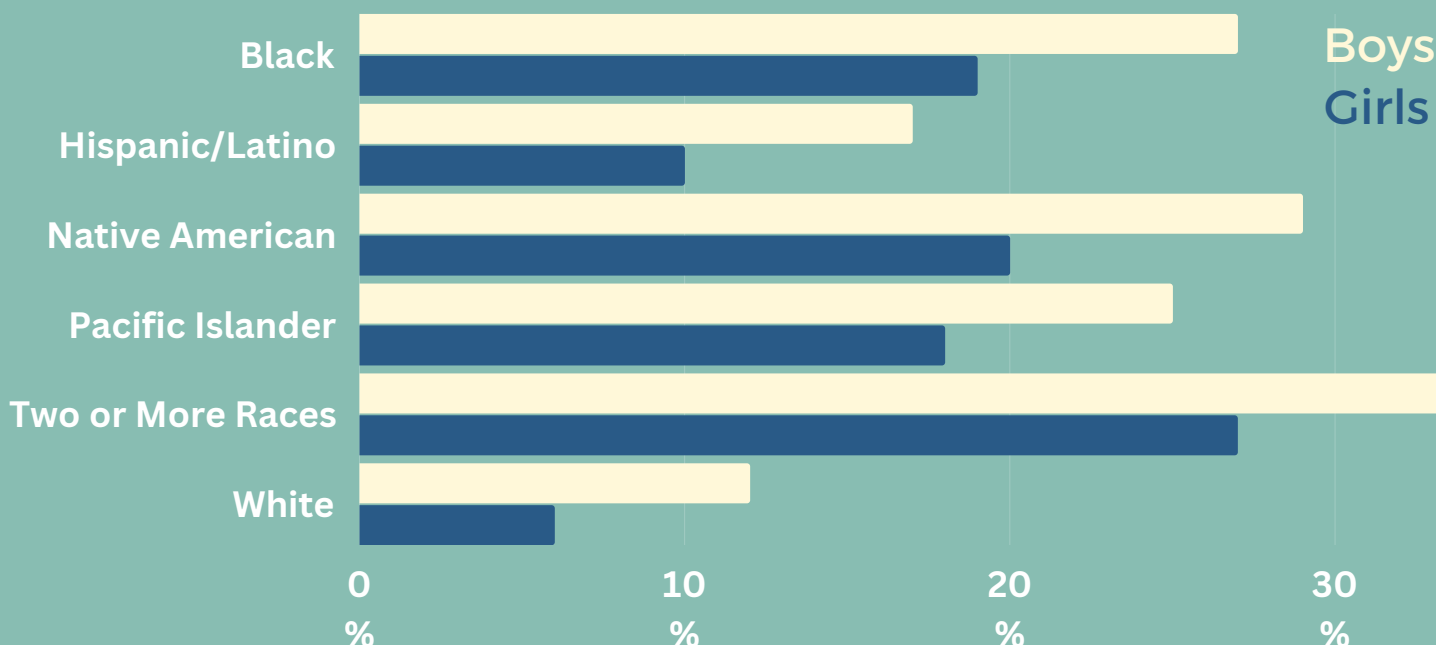
